A LOOK INSIDE THE CLASSROOM...

Chemistry students decomposed $KClO_3$ to create oxygen gas. Using the ideal gas law ($PV = nRT$) they discovered that they created 10.06 moles of O_2 !

Physical science students took a practical approach to their study of gravity by carefully dropping items out a window to find its height (distance—(time)(velocity)).

Biology students created their own classification system for cookie "organisms."

Track News: On Friday, March 16 the HS track and field team traveled to Concrete for their first meet of the year. There were 8 teams involved in this meet with four of the teams being from schools that are much larger than ours. Both the boys team and girls team placed 7th in this meet. There were several notable performances by our athletes in this meets. Johnathan Davis set a new record in the high jump going 5'6" and placing third in the meet. Annelise Buck placed 2nd in the girls javelin, throwing for a distance of 94'3". Kayla Gilmartin placed 5th in the discus and 5th in the shot put. The boys 4 X 100 relay team just missed the school record by 3 thousandths of a second and placed 3rd in this meet.

Parents, we need to address the cell phone issue. We understand that there are cases when your child needs to call home and we want to give as much freedom as possible but with reasonable controls.
