## He Is Risen!

Mr. Jorgensen will speak at secondary Chapel on Good Friday about the significance and meaning of Jesus Christ's death for us on the cross. Using a short clip from the movie "Passion of the Christ", students will be hearing and seeing the high price that was paid by Christ for our sake. We will emphasize the facts that He was marred beyond recognition, His blood was shed for us, the meaning of the torn veil and the prophecy that Jesus bones were not broken. We will read from Matthew and John's account of the crucifixion and resurrection. It is our desire that our students continually remember what Jesus did for us on the cross and the ultimate victory of His glorious resurrection.

Good Friday is one of the most important dates on the Christian calendar and this year we decided to squeeze in a Chapel service for our secondary students in the midst of Grandparent's Day. One of the reasons were showing a clip from The Passion is to give the students a visual account of what Christ endured and the event surrounding his crucifixion. We don't want our students to take for granted what Christ did for all of us. The Bible says in Romans 8:32 that "He who did not spare his own

Son, but delivered Him up for us all, how shall He not with Him also freely give us all things?" In 2 Cor. 5:21 it says "For He made Him who knew no sin to be sin for us, that we might become the righteousness of God in Him." Because of Christ's death on the cross, we get life with Him, death has "lost its sting" (1 Cor. 15:55). I recommend you take time with your family to read the various accounts of the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ and meditate on these passages as you prepare for Easter Sun-

day.

On Tuesday we took 80+ secondary students to the theater to see the film "Amazing Grace." Our students' behavior was absolutely outstanding, top notch, the best I've seen!! We're all so proud of our students. This encourages us to take more field trips with our secondary students in the future. The students had fun and enjoyed the movie.
