## A LOOK INSIDE THE CLASSROOM...

## LOCAL STUDENTS MAKE BIG CHANGE

Exceeding all expectations, the small campus of Cedar Park Everett (300 students) raised over 2,000 dollars to provide aid to the Pouye people of Papua New Guinea and to help the Dede family that serve as Assembly of God missionaries to the Pouye.

Often starved of protein, the Pouye desired to own a few ducks that could lay eggs to supplement their diet. All they needed was \$30 to reach this goal. The students in the National Honor Society, however, set their sites on a bigger goal. The Pouye also lack a consist source of clean drinking water. If they or the Dedes get thirsty, they basically need to wait for it to rain. Once it rains, the water is collected from the run-off

of the Dede's metal roof into a large, leaking 1000 gallon water tank.

To excite and inform the students about the Pouye's existence and need, the National Honor Society hosted a chapel to kick off their Bucks for Ducks! week-long coin drive. They had an event each day to motivate and remind the students about the Pouye, and had something special for the art and library pull-outs to do. At the end of each day, students could see their progress on a chart counting how many ducks their class had earned. The students' generosity was amazing to behold as their love for others guided them into donating so much. They truly understand Matt 10:8b: "Freely you have received, freely give."

Mr. Cornelissen's fifth grade

class will celebrate their victory in the coin drive on May 4 with a doughnut party. The class won in a sneak attack by turning in most of their money at the last moment. The whole class donated \$370.92. Mr. Richardson's junior geography class will celebrate with a runner-up cookie party. What's truly astounding is that most of what was collected was in pennies. There's almost 200 pounds worth of coins that the school collected.

The Pouye are grateful for the efforts of Cedar Park Everett and the National Honor Society couldn't have been more pleased at the outcome of their first large event.
