A look inside the classrooms...

Physics students gave science demonstrations to the elementary students this week. One group went to Ms. Holmes' first grade class and taught them about the three states of matter and had some cornstarch and water for them to experiment with. Another group went to Ms. Neidigh's first grade class and introduced them to surface tension using many demonstrations and mini-labs. The final group went to Mrs. Guddal's fourth grade class and taught them about sublimation (solid to gas) and made root beer for them using dry ice. All of the elementary kids loved this rare treat and can't wait for them to come back!

Mr. C's fifth grade class has been studying biomes. They were able to choose any biome—tundra, forest, desert, fresh water, etc. They had to create a poster or diorama of the biome, list several facts and present it to the class.
