A look inside the classrooms...

Mrs. Sauers' class did several experiments this week in Science. First, they demonstrated that the salt crystals will form larger crystals in proportion to the temperature of the surroundings, i.e. the hotter the room, the larger the crystals. They also tested for iron in different fruit juices.

Physics students tested Boyle's and Charles' gas laws using balloons, beakers, and thermometers.

Biology students tested their senses using sugar cubes and vanilla (bitter!), tuning forks, and by looking at images to see what sort of afterimage might appear. For example, if you look at a green, black and yellow flag for thirty seconds, and then look at a blank wall you will then see a red, white and blue flag. Students also experimented with the hot and cold receptors on the back of their hands.

The 8th grade history class is giving reports on famous Americans and their inventions. These inventions and people changed the American culture forever. Some for the good, and some that were not so good. The class is having fun and learning a lot.
