I want to thank everyone who came to the Auction last Saturday night. Our goal is for families and student to **know** Christ, to **be** changed to be more like Christ, and to **do** God's work.

**Enrollment:** If you haven't thought about where your child is going to school next year, now's the time. Re-enrollment and initial enrollment packets are still available in the office. If you have friends and neighbors who would like to give Christian education a try, let them know about CPCS. We offer tours, classroom visits and will even allow a student to "shadow" for a portion of the day. We enroll early in the spring so that we can assess the needs for curriculum and staffing as well as other changes and implementations. For instance, our secondary will move to a seven period day next year, another foreign language elective (in addition to Spanish) will be offered and we plan to implement Accelerated Reading in the elementary. We're continuing to work on implementing athletics on the elementary level. **Remember that next year's 9th-12th grade students will receive a 30% discount on tuition for 2008-2009. ### A look inside the classrooms...

3<sup>rd</sup> grade demonstrated how the size and velocity (speed) of a meteorite affect the size and depths of craters. We also talked about the differences we might find between soft topsoil as opposed to hard granite. We also made mobiles of the solar system.

Kindergarteners have been learning about author and illustrator, Eric Carle. An Eric Carle booklet colored by the class was a part of the class's Math and Science Auction Project. They are also bringing their favorite books for Show and Tell this month and Mrs. Zuvella is reading these fun books to the class.

Physics students made parallel and series circuits with light bulbs and with bells. They then used a multimeter to compare amperage and voltage for the various components for use in their circuit diagrams.
