### A look inside the classrooms...

In order to understand the various facets of Shakespeare, freshmen and sophomores have started to act out *Macbeth* as they read it and engage in discussion about characters and their motivations.

Fifth graders have been busily engaged in learning how to tie knots, discovering the techniques of fire building, conquering the rock wall, building survival shelters, and team building. Many of the students will return home with a new found appreciation for their parents and the comforts of home!

In science kindergarteners are learning about our bodies; how amazingly wonderful God made our bodies. We've learned about the 5 senses. Each student will make a booklet called I Am Fearfully and Wonderfully Made. Next in science we'll study the weather. In math, kindergarteners are measuring height and length in centimeters. They have almost learned all the "kindergarten special sounds" and are reading well.
